The magazine features sections such as local news, health & wellbeing, nature & wildlife, heritage, art, music, films & books reviews, as well as local services. Since June 2021 the magazine also includes the resilience plan for the area, updated quarterly. Since 2023 Kyle Chronicle is a member of the Public Interest News Foundation (PINF) and The Scottish Beacon, a collaborative network of independent local and hyper-local newsrooms.
